CIVIL WAR LETTER OF SAMUEL R. NUCKOLS'

Mt. Jackson, Va. August 27th, 1864

Mr. L. R. Swift,

Dear Brother, you doubtless have heard this of my being wounded and there is no chance of getting away only on wagon to Staunton, and I will start for Staunton in a few days, or as soon as I can travel. You will do me a favor if my wife has not heard of my being wounded to send her word as soon as you receive this. And if any one comes for me, they will come direct to Staunton as they are giving furlough from that place. I stand a very good chance to get one. I received my wound the 20th day of this month and I am glad to say it is doing well. I received a gun-shot in my wright (sic) should (sic) and arm all with the same ball. The ball is in my arm as yet - in the elbow. But don't suffer any uneasiness about me, as I am doing finely, and hope to be home soon.

And truly I remain your until death.
